Herm Breuer, director of the Trumbull County Office of the Veterans Service Commission (TCVSC) for the past two years, was the guest speaker at our Chapter's most recent dinner meeting on March 26, 2015 at the Consolidated Activities Center, Youngstown Air Reserve Station in Vienna. Speaking before our largest gathering to date, Mr. Breuer mesmerized our members with his experiences in Iraq as a turret gunner for the detail that provided security for the Commander of Northern Iraq. Among the many awards he received for his service, the Purple Heart was earned for being wounded by a roadside bomb

"OUR NATION WILL ETERNALLY HONOR THE HEROES OF FLIGHT 93" during one of those scary encounters. Herm proceeded to speak at length about the various and diverse benefits and services the Trumbull County Veterans Service Commission offers to honorably discharged veterans from all walks of life who may need some form of assistance either financially or otherwise.

The VSC provides professional assistance in filing claims for federal benefits earned while in the service of our nation. The list of federal benefits include service-connected compensation, non-service connected pension, burial benefits, VA life insurance and educational benefits. There are a number of State benefits that the office can also provide assistance in obtaining. These include license plates, hunting and fishing licenses, Ohio War Orphans Scholarships, Ohio Children's Home and the Ohio Veteran's Home. Among the benefits that are funded directly by Trumbull County through its 1/2 mill property tax assessment include: rent or mortgage payments, utilities, heating oil, real estate taxes, home owners insurance, clothing, transportation, limited medical, food, and transportation to Cleveland VA hospitals. The VSC will provide emergency financial assistance not only to veterans but also to widows and children of veterans who are in need. However, certain requirements must be met before financial assistance can be given.

Aptly suited for the job as Director, Mr. Breuer is actively involved in other veteran organizations as a Commander of the Military Order of the Purple Heart Chapter 606, Service Officer for the DAV Chapter 11, and Chaplain and Service Officer for VFW Post 1090. He is also a member of the Iraq and Afghanistan Veterans of America, the Wounded Warrior Project, and a member of the National Association of County Veterans Service Officers. In October 2011, he became the first veteran of Iraq or Afghanistan to be elected as the President of the Ohio State Association of County Veteran Service Officers where he represented all 88 county officers and over 250 Service Officers.

During his presentation, Herm brought out several interesting facts about the TCVSC. Within the State of Ohio, which has the 6th largest veteran population in the US, the VSC is unique in composition and operation to all the other Veteran Service Commissions in the United States. The Commission is comprised of five members from local Veteran Organizations who are appointed by a judge. Presently the office is staffed by five service officers and two administrative personnel. In the past year the office has been able to transport between 1600 and 1800 veterans to the Cleveland VA Hospital using a van on a daily basis. The office provides

Legislative Issues – April 2015

Legislative Affairs Co-Chair, COL John Koshan

Congress continues its work on the FY 2015 Budgets and there is not a lot of legislative accomplishments to report on since our last newsletter. Congress did manage to squeeze in a Spring break and an Easter Recess. Our hope is that all of our members enjoyed a blessed Easter Holiday.

As the Budget continues to take center stage we see the recommendations of the Military Compensation Retirement Modernization Committee (MCRMC)

becoming more of the discussion. As we have discussed in the last several newsletters these recommendations were designed to modernize Military Pay and Benefits so as to generate budget savings for the Defense Department. MOAA has been testifying along with other advocacy groups on the pros and cons of these recommendations. **BIG** questions remain as to the lasting effects these recommendations could have on the wellbeing of our Military.

The changes to the Retirement system would provide for a 401K-type program, similar to the civilian workforce. Under the proposal service members would see a reduction in retired pay but would receive matching government contributions. This new system, unlike today's system, would allow a service member who retires with less than 20 years to receive retired pay, but a member who retires at 20 years or more would get paid less from year 20 until full retirement than they would otherwise get in today's system.

The MCRMC also recommends privatizing TRICARE with service members and their families moving to a health care system similar to Federal Civilian employees. MOAA believes this is detrimental to the force. The Surgeon's General echoes MOAA's concerns.

Most recently the White House has given cautious support for the changes proposed by the MCRMC. MOAA is encouraging the administration to consider its (MOAA's) testimony given to the House Armed Services subcommittees. When considering these changes its important to remember that past attempts of this nature have had negative effects on recruiting and retention.

Changing pay and benefit programs can have negative effects on the force but the BIG specter or the 1000lb Gorilla, hanging over everything is SEQUESTRATION. No amount of words can adequately describe the negatives that this will have on our military. Forced to enact the Budget cuts required by SEQUESTRATION would in effect reduce our military to "Pretender Status", a hollow force. The recent House of Representatives proposed budget added monies to a "wartime" funding account not subjected to Sequestration Caps thereby boosting overall Defense spending. Some Budget trickery, but the real solution is to solve our nation's Budget Deficit and eliminate SEQUESTRATION. The Budget Deficit is this country's greatest security threat.

MOAA continues to lobby our legislators making the case against the recommendation s of the MCRMC and SEQUESTRAION. On April 15^{th,} MOAA will **Storm The Hill** and visit all of our legislators. Significant areas of discussion will be;

- Sustain Military Pay and Benefits
 - Retirement Basic Pay and Allowances
- Reject Disproportional TRICARE Fees and Changes
- Eliminate SEQUESTRATION cuts

MOAA has provided fact sheets/talking points on these topics at their Web site and are available to all members for their individual use. Additionally, messages and letters are also available for members to send 'as is' to their political representative or to use as a guide for a personal appeal. It is extremely important that our voices be heard.

for all the American flags and rods to decorate the grave sites throughout the County for Memorial Day. Herm recounted a personal experience with one nursing home vet who was only receiving a 10% disability compensation. When Herm found out that he was a POW who survived the Bataan death march, he was able to get his disability increased to 100%. This particular vet had only been in captivity for a few days but survived the Bataan death march by escaping and living in the jungle until the end of the war.

The Community Activity Center (CAC), "Herk's Place", is building #113. (You'll see a loading dock, back entrance of CAC) Parking is available on either side of the building but it is easier to enter the dining area from the upper parking lot. (There are a few stairs.)
