Legislative Issues – June 16

Our legislative update for June is similar to our updates of the past few months in that we continue to follow the money. Money, that is for the FY 2017 Defense Authorization Bill.

The House has passed their version of the Defense Authorization Bill, setting up a summer long negotiation process with their senate counterparts. The House version calls for a 2.1% Military pay raise starting in January 2017, a big boost in Army personnel and an overhaul of the Military Medi-

cal Care System. Additionally, the House shifted about \$18billion from the Overseas Contin**gency Operation** funds, war fighting funds, into the base Defense budget, to pay for ships, fighter jets, and personnel that the president's budget did not request but the service chiefs did. The House's approach cuts off war funding on April 30, 2017, forcing the next Presidential Administration to make a new war fighting supplemental request. The current Administration does not agree with this approach and has threatened a veto if this use of Contingency funds is in the final Defense Authorization Bill.

The Senate meanwhile, continues to labor in passing its version of the Defense Bill. The Senate's version stays primarily with the administrations recommendation of a 1.6% Military pay raise. The Senate's version of the Defense Bill does not follow the House approach in the use of Overseas Contingency Operations funding. The Senate's approach would be to seek authorization for more Defense dollars in a separate action on the Senate floor. Essentially the Senate's version of the Defense Authorization Bill matches the Administration's budget proposal. Seeking additional Defense dollars increases the likelihood of a budget battle over reconciliation in that any increase in spending requires a matching decrease in spending.

The Senate has yet to pass its version of the FY 2017 Defense Authorization Bill. The Senate Armed Services Committee drafted its bill in record time but the Bill has attracted over **500** amendments on everything from Guantanamo Detainees to Pentagon employee's titles. "Heavy Stuff."

With 500 amendments there was no end in sight to debate, therefore the Majority leader filed a cloture motion on the entire Defense Bill and the vote succeeded. This means that restrictions will be placed on debate time and the type of amendments to be debated. Look for a long period of time before something comes out of the Senate.

The differences between the House and Senate versions as we know them now is significant. Especially the issue of Overseas Contingency Operations funding. Time is fleeting and as we have noted before the House and Senate have to reconcile with each other and present a completed Bill to both Houses with final passage and forwarded to the President for approval in the last quarter of this year.

Speculation is that the Congress will end the year as in years past, DEADLOCKED, with a stop gap measure to fund the government. (Another continuing resolution CR)

As we have in the past we continue to encourage all of our members to support MOAA's efforts in pressing Congress on issues affecting the Military, both Active and Retired. During this period of budget debate, MOAA continues to inform and educate our law makers. We can help in this process by talking with and writing to our congressional representatives. The Legislative Action Center at MOAA's web site provides talking points and letters that we can modify or send as is to our representatives. Events of the past few days and this being an election year leave little room for business as usual. Our wellbeing as a nation depends on our Military.




