

Youngstown Business Incubator – A Critical Role in Regional Economic Development

The Mahoning and Shenango Valleys Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America held their monthly luncheon meeting at the Consolidated Activities Center of the Youngstown Air Reserve Station in Vienna, OH on February 24, 2017. With record setting temperature of 75 degrees for this day in February, beating the previous high of 67 set in 1961, a near record attendance listened to LTC Rich Lonardo, USA, Ret., as he presented an overview of the highly acclaimed Youngstown Business Incubator (YBI) and its critical role in regional economic development. As a retired Army Officer and a consultant at the YBI, Lonardo explained how the YBI provides invaluable start up services to new and emerging businesses by providing resources that enable entrepreneurs to succeed. These resources include facilities, equipment, entrepreneurial counseling, education, and mentoring, and assistance from Youngstown State University. YBI was established in 1995 primarily as a general purpose business incubator. Today it has expanded to its 5th building in downtown Youngstown and focuses primarily on information technology startups. Many of the new start-ups fostered by the Youngstown Business Incubator choose to stay, rent office space, and house their business in the YBI buildings. One such company, Turning Technologies, a privately held software company, rents a whole building from YBI and employs 250 employees.

Another key area for which the YBI is nationally known is the rapidly growing use of 3D printing technology to produce a multitude of products using an additive manufacturing process. In conjunction with YSU, the YBI was the 2nd in the nation to obtain a 3D sand printer which is used to make cast metal moldings. Many military services including the 910th Airlift Wing at the YARS have benefited with enormous cost savings by replicating parts through 3D printing technology that may not be in the supply system,

have low volume production, or which were produced by a company that is now defunct.

To highlight the importance that the Youngstown Business Incubator plays in the Youngstown regional area, the YBI



was ranked number one in the world two years ago for fostering business start-ups. Today, it still ranks number one in the United States. At the conclusion of Rich Lonardo's presentation, our president, LTC Gary Williams presented the speaker a MSVC flag set.

President Gary Williams introduced a new member, Audrey Chengelis to our Chapter along with a visiting MOAA member, George Hagstrom, who belongs to the French Creek Chapter in Meadville, PA. Former LT Florence Hosler presented the Legislative Moment by spotlighting the efforts of MOAA National to rectify the unequal treatment of service benefits for Reservists who are called up for Active Duty versus full time Regular Active Duty personnel.

Congratulations to 50/50 winners Janet Oglesby and John Koshan. Once again Dennis Gartland and his wife, Esther, donated beautiful ladies bracelets to enhance the 50/50 drawing. gifts, purchased gifts and had an enjoyable time doing so. Pat yourself on the back and the MSVC board thank you for this recognition.

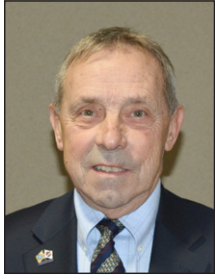

Legislative Issues – February 2017

Not a lot of legislative activity has been occurring since our last update, in fact very little has been accomplished as Congress has been in recess for the past few weeks. Members have spent time in their districts listening to their constituents or in some cases traveling the world and being critical of the administration.

With the new administration in place there has been a lot of conjecture and second guessing as to what the President will propose in his first budget. As you recall from our previous updates, the president has called for increased priority be given to the military, both in equipment and in manpower. In fact, the Defense Department escaped the hiring freeze levied by the administration on all federal agencies. Recently, the President's spoke to his priority for the military in his most recent address to both Houses of Congress. He left little doubt as to what his priorities would be.

However, there are several key parts to the budget puzzle that are critical and affect future spending decisions which will result in many discussions and changes in direction. The government is currently operating under a continuing resolution (CR) that is due to expire on April 28th thereby shutting off the funding spigot. Additionally, a decision on the DEBT limit will have to be debated and voted on by Congress about the same time frame, and the specter of the of mandatory budget cuts under our old friend **SEQUESTRATION** returns for FY2018. This all should provide interesting viewing to those who follow the political process.

As we have stated many times, SEQUESTRATION has and continues to overly affect the Department of Defense. MOAA has made ending SEQUESTRATION a Major Legislative goal for 2017. The President has called on Congress to repeal this action. But given the political and fiscal environment the Congress has few options. The President's priorities for our nation as outlined in his most recent speech to the Congress demand a strengthen and state of the art military. Increased spending for the military, done correctly, must occur to meet the Administrations priorities.

In the February edition of the *Military Officer*, were preprinted letters to key Congressional leaders urging them to take action on SEQUESTRATION? All of us should have taken the opportunity to submit these letters. As veterans and citizens, we have a role to play and our voice can make a difference. Our support of MOAA's Legislative Actions and our willingness to express our opinions on issues to our congressional representatives remain essential to our well-being as a nation.

Dick and Rod to Storm the Hill in April



On Wednesday, April 5, Dick Calta and Rod Hosler will represent the Ohio Council of Chapters in the annual MOAA "Storming the Hill" event. Their plan is to have in place appointments with all Ohio legislators that day. 3-D Printed Prosthetic Covers for Military Amputees[©]

Additive manufacturing, or 3-D printing, is changing the way prosthetics are manufactured and, in the process, changing the lives of military amputees.

By the close of 2015, more than 1,600 soldiers who fought in Iraq and Afghanistan had major limb amputations due to wounds suffered during combat, according to the Congressional Research Service.

UNYQ is one company using 3-D printing to give “amputees a way to express themselves authentically,” says CEO Eythor Bender. 3-D printing is a process of turning digital 3-D models into solid objects and has helped wounded servicemembers in their recovery by allowing them to be part of the design process.

Bender says veterans have input in the design of their prosthetic cover and can choose from 30 standard designs and colors or custom create their own design. He says the shape and volume of the cover “will mimic their sound limb to recreate symmetry between their legs.”

Bender says many insurance companies and the VA reimburse for UNYQ prosthetic covers, so there is no cost to the veteran.

Army veteran Katherine Crawford, who lost her leg in a training-related injury, says her custom UNYQ prosthetic cover has changed the conversation from people asking, “What happened?” to saying, “Wow, that’s cool!”
