The Mahoning & Shenango Valleys Chapter of the Military Officers Association of America hosted an awards dinner at the Consolidated Activities Center of the Youngstown Air Reserve Station (YARS) in Vienna on Thursday, May 11th to honor recently commissioned YSU Officers, YSU Cadets, and Junior ROTC Cadets. In attendance were 30 MSVC members, two Cadets, and four guests. Receiving the MOAA Medal and a cash incentive in the Junior ROTC category was Cadet Michael Crites, a Lordstown resident who will be graduating in the Spring of 2018 from Trumbull Career and Technical Center (TCTC). Cadet Crites was accompanied by his JROTC instructor, Lt Col John Miller, Air Force, Ret., Michael's father, Adam Crites, and his grandparents, Thomas and Bekie Drass. With approximately 78 cadets enrolled in the JROTC at TCTC, Michael was chosen to receive the MOAA medal because of his leadership in coordinating over 1700 hours of community service projects by the TCTC cadets. From the program

In 1996, a small group of University employees and students with prior military service formed the YSU Armed Forces Association. The following year, the Association held its first *Reading of the Names* to honor those associated with our University, through employment or attendance, who died while on active duty in the armed forces of our nation. That year 52 names were read. Since then, 15 names have been added to the list.

Their names aloud so they are each remembered and honored. Their names were once spoken there at YSU as rolls were called. It seems right, in the best of military traditions, that we bring them home and call roll again.

graduation. Unable to attend the dinner was the MOAA Medal award winner from East High School, Cadet Aaron Santos.

The ROTC MOAA Medal recipient was Cadet Zachary Szewczyk, currently a junior at Youngstown State University majoring in Computer Science. Zachary will graduate and be commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Army in May of 2018. Although the Army will ultimately determine which branch he will serve, Zach has high expectations of being selected to serve in the Cyber Division, a relatively new branch of the Army that deals with matters of cyber warfare and security. There are currently 26 cadets in the junior class which includes Kent State, but only three are attending YSU. As a homeschooled Youngstown resident, Zachary was motivated to follow in the footsteps of his father who served 24 years in the Army and a veteran of the Gulf War and also his grandfather who served in the Navy. This July Zach will be attending advanced camp at Fort Knox, Kentucky. Also, unable to attend the dinner was 2LT Lonnie Bissmeyer, Signal Corp, the other YSU ROTC MOAA Medal recipient who will be finishing academic requirements this summer.

Winners of the 50/50 raffle were Audrey Chengelis and Ralph Minton. MSVC is hosting the State Convention at the YARS on 23 September. Lt Gen Atkins will be the keynote speaker at the convention. Ammunition Last year all weapons owners brought their own ammo, we will assume that will be the case this year. We hope to have a system in place for reimbursement of ammo when using another person's weapon.

Parking & Travel at the Air Show continue

If you arrive at a lot that is full, you will be directed to the next lot. Do not go to a lot that you have not been directed to, because YOU WILL NOT GET PICKED UP if we end up not using that lot. Information on which lots are full will be available on local radio stations, so you can adjust to the next one in line. All the parking lots are within a couple miles of each other.

When departing the show, ensure you get onto a bus labeled with the name of the lot at which you parked. If you end up going to the wrong lot, locate a Security/Sheriff Deputy for assistance.

SECURITY: EVERYONE will be screened by security prior to getting on a bus. If you refuse to be screened, you will not be admitted to the event. Pay close attention to the prohibited items list, and the screening process will go quickly.





Portman, Brown Introduce Legislation to Designate Ohio Veterans Memorial and Museum as National Museum

On April 6, U.S. Senators Rob Portman (R-OH) and Sherrod Brown (D-OH) introduced the National Veterans Memorial and Museum Act, legislation to designate the Ohio Veterans Memorial and Museum in Columbus as the National Veterans Museum and Memorial. The museum will serve as a landmark Representatives Steve Stivers (R-OH), Joyce Beatty (D-OH) and Pat Tiberi (R-OH) introduced companion legislation in the House.

"Our veterans have made countless sacrifices on our behalf, and we owe our freedom and liberty to their bravery," said Senator Portman. "It is important that our future generations know about the selfless sacrifices made by so many men and women of the armed forces and their families. The National Veterans Memorial and Museum is one way we can commemorate not only brave Ohioans, but all American veterans. I hope the Senate will join us in supporting his legislation."
