Steak Fry at YARS with Speaker Senator Michele Brooks

The MSVC held their annual Steak Fry at the YARS in Vienna but threatening rain brought the "picnic" inside the CAC. Almost 40 members and guests enjoyed a deliciously prepared steak filet, baked potato, corn-on-the-cob, and all the trimmings. After the scrumptious meal, LTC Rod Hosler and COL Dick Calta previewed the up-coming Ohio Council of Chapters Convention Friday, 22 September to Saturday, 23 September which our Chapter is hosting for the very first time here at the Youngstown Air Reserve Station. (MSVC turn to host again will be in 14 years). All seven chapters will be present and MOAA National is mailing out over 1000 invitations to MOAA members in the regional area eligible to attend. Because this event is in lieu of our regular chapter meeting, Rod and Dick encouraged maximum participation from our Chapter membership.

Another reason for wanting to attend this convention is that for only the second time in our five year history has a 3-star level officer ever visited our Chapter. The last time that happened was when we received our Charter. This time Lt Gen Dana Atkins, USAF, Retired, President and CEO of MOAA, will be the keynote speaker at our Saturday banquet. He will also present our chapter with the prestigious MOAA Five-Star Levels of Excellence Award. We finally achieved the top award after three successive Four-Star Awards. This Five-Star Award ranks us in the top 20% of all MOAA Chapters nationally, regardless of their size. The list of speakers and presenters to the Convention is impressive. Your interest levels will be maintained at peak levels for sure throughout the day. You will not be disappointed.

The guest speaker for the evening was Pennsylvania State Senator, Michele Brooks, who represents the 50th Senatorial District encompassing all of Crawford and Mercer counties and parts of Erie and Warren counties. After serving as Mercer County Commissioner and State Representative for the 17th District, Michele was elected to the PA Senate in November 2014, the first woman to do so in each District. Senator Brooks serves on a number of committees. She is the Chair of the Senate Aging and Youth Committee, Vice-Chair of the Health and Human Services Committee, and a member of other committees including Veterans Affairs. As such she is very involved in getting service dogs for veterans and setting up a Veterans Trust Fund which generates over one million dollars for veterans by way of a donation on a check off box on state income tax returns. She has introduced legislation to fly the US Flag and the POW/MIA flag at all service station plazas on the Turnpike and Interstate highways in PA. She also has introduced legislation to grant real estate exemptions for disabled veterans equal to the rated percentage of disability. Senator Brooks ended her presentation with a story of how our national anthem, The Star-Spangled Banner, came to be written by Francis Scott Key after the horrific all day and night-long bombardment of Ft McHenry on September 13-14, 1814. The poem written by Key officially became the national anthem of the United States in 1931.

On the Ohio Ballot in November

STATE ISSUE 2: "To require state agencies to not pay more for prescription drugs than the federal Department of Veterans Affairs and require state payment of attorney fees and expenses to specific individuals for defense of the law"

Vote NO on issue 2 Costly-Deceptive-Unworkable.

Costly

- Ohio doctors, nurses, pharmacists and hospitals oppose the ballot issue because it could actually increase costs for the 7 million Ohioans—nearly two-thirds of our population— who are left out, including those with private insurance and those who rely on Medicare or otherwise do not obtain medications through state programs.
- Military veterans could also pay more for prescription drugs.
- Three Ohio Medicaid directors who served in both Democratic and Republican administrations and a state budget director warn the ballot issue could reduce patient access to medications.
- An unprecedented provision gives ballot sponsors a blank check by allowing them to intervene in any legal challenges and requires taxpayers to pay their attorney fees, win or lose.

Deceptive

- An Ohio budget director says the claim that the ballot issue would save \$400 million annually is "simply false" and based on an assumption that Ohio does not already receive substantial prescription discounts. In fact, Ohio's Medicaid program receives federally mandated and voluntarily negotiated discounts that bring its costs down to levels similar to those of the VA.
- Ohio Medicaid directors warn the ballot issue could invalidate existing drug discount agreements—potentially increasing the state's prescription costs by tens of millions of dollars annually.

Unworkable

- Health care experts say requiring Ohio to purchase drugs at the lowest price paid by the VA would be impossible to implement because, by law, the VA does not disclose this price.
- The ballot issue contains no language guiding implementation—and was proposed by a controversial California health care CEO without consulting any Ohio officials tasked with implementation—which will lead to bureaucratic in-fighting, delays, lawsuits and higher costs for taxpayers.

Ohio MOAA members are urged to vote NO on Issue #2.

Ohioans pay too much for life-saving medicine. Drug companies have completely rigged the system so you pay more. Washington, DC doesn't negotiate fair prices with drug companies, so it's up to the states to enact reforms. To do that we must change Ohio law and vote YES on Issue 2. Here are the facts:

Vote Yes

- Issue 2 changes Ohio law to ensure we pay the lowest known price for medicine. Ohioans would save \$400 million, which would help fund schools, police departments, and cut taxes. Instead, that money goes to drug companies.
- Drug companies keep driving up prices on medicines needed to treat everything from asthma to cancer until they become too expensive for you to afford or insurance to cover. Life-saving medicine for children with allergies has skyrocketed from \$80 to over \$600 – just one of many examples.
- Drug companies fueled their profits by lying about opioids. They paid doctors over \$46 million to get them to overprescribe opioid pain medication, getting Ohioans hooked, killing kids, and destroying our communities.

These are the same drug companies spending millions of dollars to get you to vote against this issue – all so they can protect their profits.

Politicians make promises they never keep. They say they'll lower the cost of healthcare, but then the lobbyists and political donations come, and our costs don't go down—they only go up.

Here's your chance to change that.

You can hold politicians and drug companies accountable even while they threaten to retaliate against us. They say they'll hurt veterans and raise prices on senior citizens. But you can stand up to them. Take the power into your own hands. Join doctors, nurses, and veterans from across Ohio and bring change that is desperately needed. Vote yes on Issue 2

A Driver's License Number Is Now Required to Obtain YARS Access 10 Days Before the Event

Ten days before an event on the Youngstown Air Base, I have to submit a Base Entry Access Request form to base security. On this form are all our chapter members that do not have a military ID. The form has you name and birthdate. This allows you to pass through security with your driver's license without being escorted by the military police.

Starting in **OCTOBER** the birthdate has to be replaced with your <u>driver's license number</u>. If you wish to have your spouses name on the list that is up to you. I prefer if you can email me your driver's license number—you may call me. Thanks for your corporation on this matter.
