Congress continues to dither over partisan issues and finger pointing while ignoring the major issues of concern to our membership and the country. Balloon spending on "emergency issues" has put key legislative actions on the back burner. Frivolous programs continue to be funded with these "emergency issues" at the sake of real legislation designed to help America's military community.

Please take action now to urge our legislators to act on the potential elimination of 18,000 Military Medical Billets and Restructuring Military Treatment Facilities (MTFs). The July edition of the Military Officer magazine has several preprinted letters to be sent to the Congressional leadership soliciting support regarding the elimination of Military Medical facilities and personnel slated for the National Defense Authorization Act of 2021 (FY 2021 NDAA). TOM HANKS NEW FILM 'GREYHOUND'

Tom Hanks has come full circle. After vividly depicting D-Day from the perspective of 2nd Ranger Battalion in *Saving Private Ryan*, the European Theatre via the 101st Airborne Division in *Band of Brothers*, and Pacific Theatre operations with the Marine Corps in *The Pacific*, he's starring in *Greyhound*, which recounts Navy operations during World War II.

Enlisting director Aaron Schneider, Hanks — the film's star, screenwriter, and producer — adapts C.S. Forester's *The Good Shepherd* (Little Brown & Co., 1955) into a suspenseful account of seafaring heroism. Hanks plays a career officer facing off against a fleet of German U-boats — and his own self-doubts — in the early days of U.S. involvement in the war.
